Begonia, Non-stop ☀️ Shade/Part Sun
Basic Care: Keep soil evenly moist. Fertilize every 2 weeks. Avoid getting water on flowers and foliage. Best to water in the morning.
Common Uses: Hanging baskets on porches or indoors.



Caladium ☁️ Shade
Basic Care: Water and feed regularly, plant in rich well drained soils.
Common Uses: Valuable addition in shady gardens.



Dahlia ☀️ Sun
Basic Care: Plant in rich well-drained soil. Deadhead as flowers fade. Deep watering 2-3 times per week, and more in dry, hot climates.
Common Uses: Brilliant, big blooms in sunny locations.



Gerbera Daisy ☀️ Sun
Basic Care: Let plant become moderately dry between waterings. Fertilize every 2 weeks. Needs good drainage.
Common Uses: Gardens, potted plant, and cut flowers



Hybrid Impatiens (New Guinea) ☁️ Shade
Basic Care: Consistent moisture is the key. Water less in shade, more in sun, heat and wind.
Common Uses: Great for baskets and containers.



Impatiens, Double (Fiesta) ☀️☁️ Partial Sun/Shade
Basic Care: Consistent moisture is the key. Water less in shade, more in sun, heat and wind.
Common Uses: Great displays in baskets, mixed containers, pots and landscapes.



Ivy Geranium ☀️ Sun
Basic Care: Drench soil and let it become moderately dry between waterings. Fertilize weekly.
Common Uses: Hanging baskets, and window boxes (trailing stems).



Lantana ☀️ Sun
Basic Care: Carefree plant. Water weekly when soil is dry. Increased growth can be achieved by pruning.
Common Uses: Used in containers and beds.



Sunpatiens ☀️ Sun
Basic Care: Water when soil is dry to touch. Moderately apply slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Plant in full sun or shade. Remove old blooms.
Common Uses: In container, garden beds, or baskets.

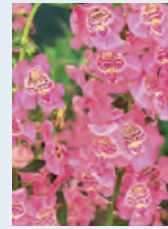

home temperatures of 65-70°F (18-21°C).

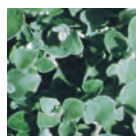

Licorice, Heather, & Sweet Potato Vine:



Licorice (*Helichrysum petiolare*)

Attractive rounded leaves are borne on a moderately trailing plant. Foliage contrasts with and highlights other plants, making this a superb addition to containers, hanging baskets and gardens. Combines well with geranium, verbena and dwarf delphinium. Prefers well-drained soil.

Mexican Heather (*Cuphea hyssopifolia*)

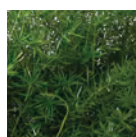

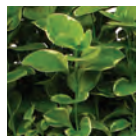

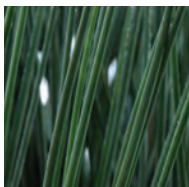


Grasses:



Amazon Mist – *Carex albula*
Graceful, flowing mounds of finetextured ornamental grass are lovely spilling over slopes and walls. Attractive in containers, in rock gardens, and at garden's edge. Cut back to 3-4" as new growth begins in spring. A good houseplant where not winter hardy.

Space 18" (46 cm) apart Prefers consistent soil moisture
USDA zone 7 (0°F) to USDA zone 10 (30°F)



Blue Arrows (*Juncus inflexus*)
Narrow, straight gray-blue leaves in stiff clumps are great for adding structure to gardens and containers. Although heat and drought tolerant, it also can be grown as a pond plant, where plants create a natural transition from water to garden.

Space 10-12" (25-31 cm) apart Prefers well-drained soil
USDA zone 5 (-20°F) to USDA zone 9 (20°F)



Bronco (*Carex comans*)
Beautiful fine-textured foliage forms graceful, flowing mounds. Lovely spilling over slopes and walls, in containers, and at garden's edge. Attractive planted with blue grasses such as little bluestem or blue lyme grass and bold-textured plants.

Space 12-15" (31-38 cm) apart Prefers consistent soil moisture
USDA zone 7 (0°F) to USDA zone 10 (30°F)



Festina (*Festuca cinerea*)
Exceptional soft blue foliage creates a sea of texture and color when massed. An effective accent when planted alone or in small groups. Full sun and dry soil conditions give it the deepest blue color.

Space 10-12" (25-31 cm) apart Prefers well-drained soil
USDA zone 5 (-20°F) to USDA zone 9 (20°F)



Live Wire – “Fiber Optic Grass”
(*Isolepis cernua*)

A compact form of an unusual, densely tufted clumping grass that produces thin, hairlike leaves. Great addition to mixed containers, along ponds, or as an indoor plant.

☀ Full to part sun Grows 6-8" (15-20 cm) tall
Space 18-20" (46-51 cm) apart Grows well at water's edge or in bog gardens
USDA zone 8 (10°F) to USDA zone 10 (30°F)



Pony Tails – *Stipa tenuissima* (Feather Grass)

This native grass is valued in the garden for its strong form and bold flowering habit. Slender, silky green flower spikes bloom above bright green clumps of foliage and dry to a beautiful golden color. Flower plumes are excellent for dried arrangements.

Space 24-30" (61-76 cm) apart
Water at least once a week until established

Red Rooster (*Carex buechananii*)

Attractive fine-textured ornamental grass. Excellent in the perennial garden or as a ground cover. The cinnamon colored foliage is outstanding planted with silver foliage plants, brightly colored flowers or variegated grasses.

Space 24" (61 cm) apart
Prefers consistent soil moisture

Spiralis (*Juncus effusus*)

This hardy bog plant has unusual, grasslike, wiry, twisted stems. Very effective when grown in containers and excellent in dried floral arrangements. Prefers continually moist, acidic (sour) soil.

Space 8-10" (20-25 cm) apart
Grows well at water's edge or in bog gardens

Beans, Derby

1990 All-American Selection Winner! Bush type plant yielding 6" long green beans all season long. Best if picked when 5" long. Great freezing and canning variety.

Beans, Green and Gold

These French, filet-type beans are thinner and smaller than other green beans, but have a delicious flavor and crispy texture. Beans are ready to harvest

about 2 weeks after they bloom. Pick frequently to prevent beans from getting too starchy and eat them as quickly as possible or freeze, if necessary.

Broccoli, Destiny

Mid-early maturing variety, and performs well for fall harvest in the Desert Southwest. Dwarf plants produce broccoli with a nice smooth

dome and round shape. Destiny has medium-small beads with good heat tolerance

Broccoli, Gypsy

Gypsy is versatile for summer or fall harvest and provides uniform well-domed heads with a medium-small bead size and medium-sized stem. Large, healthy plants tolerate heat and are resistant to downy mildew. Suitable for bunching or crown cut.

Brussel Sprouts, Jade Cross

Popular early maturing variety. Deep green sprouts are spaced closely on medium sized plants. High yield medium sized sprouts. Holds well in adverse weather.

Cabbage, (early) Fast Vantage

Fast Vantage matures quickly, resulting in 2.5-lb, medium, green heads up to 6 weeks earlier than other cabbage varieties. Cabbages can take some heat, but they love the cold, which means that you

can have a cabbage or two gracing the garden in Spring and Fall, as well as Summer.

Cabbage, (late) Bravo

This rugged hybrid produces large, round heads that are uniform with a beautiful blue-green color. Semi-flattened globe shaped head. Use 10-12 inch spacing.

Cabbage, Chinese, Chinese Express

Superior when spring planted, China Express offers good bolt resistance and excellent uniformity, with the mild, sweet, and tender crispness of the finest Napa cabbage. The medium green, stocky, barrel-shaped heads are tightly packed and weigh 4-5 pounds after trimming

Cabbage, Flat Dutch Late

This variety offers large, broad, flat heads, weighing 10 to 15 lbs. and measuring 7 x 14 in. The low-growing heads have a short core and excellent wrapper leaves. May grow poorly in hot weather but revives quickly with onset of cool, wet weather. Has very good keeping quality.

Cabbage, Golden Acre Early

This beautiful, early cabbage produces tender heads that are 5"-7" in diameter. Golden Acre's compact plants are ideal for small gardens and it can be planted closer together than other cabbage varieties. It is noted for its uniform, round and tightly folded heads.

Cabbage, Red Acre

An early red cabbage that produces dense, deep purple, small round heads great for colorful slaws, salads, and cooking. It won't split when planted in the spring, and is one of the best cabbages for winter storage when planted in the late summer for fall harvest.

so start it early.

Snow Crown is always mild and sweet. Its hybrid vigor and rapid growth make it one of the easiest to grow of all early cauliflower varieties. It forms fully

domed curds in heads 7-8 inches across, weighing 1-2 pounds. This variety maintains its prime eating quality for up to 10 days in the garden. May manifest a delicate pink blush when maturing in the hotter parts of summer.

Celery, Greenbay

a biennial plant reaching 12 to 24 inches tall. A temperate-climate crop, celery grows best between 59 and 70 degrees Fahrenheit. This vegetable tolerates frosty cold weather when planted in fertile, moist soil that drains well.

Cucumbers, Burpless

This vigorous vining plant delivers armloads of the most delicious cukes you will ever eat, all entirely bitter- and burp-free! The fruit reaches 10 to 12 inches long, slender and cylindrical, with faint stripes on the

necks and a deep green, smooth, thin skin.

Cucumbers, Marketmore

This slicing cucumber has 8-9" long, slender, dark green fruits that maintain their uniform color even under weather stress. Begins bearing late, but picks for a relatively long time

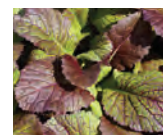

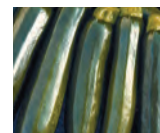

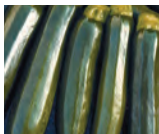
